

Approved application

The tested AMS is suitable for use as a dust monitor for filter monitoring downstream of filter systems at plants according to Directive 2010/75/EC, chapter III (13th BImSchV:2021), chapter IV (17th BImSchV:2021), 2015/2193/EC (44th BImSchV:2021), 27th BImSchV:2013, 30th BImSchV:2019 and TA Luft:2021. The measured ranges have been selected so as to ensure as broad a field of application as possible.

The suitability of the AMS for this application was assessed on the basis of a laboratory test and a 3 month field test at an industrial drying facility producing ceramic floor coverings.

The AMS is approved for an ambient temperature range of -20° to +50°C.

The notification of suitability of the AMS, performance testing and the uncertainty calculation have been effected on the basis of the regulations applicable at the time of testing. As changes in legal provisions are possible, any potential user should ensure that this AMS is suitable for monitoring the measured values / emission limit values relevant to the application.

Any potential user should ensure, in consultation with the manufacturer, that this AMS is suitable for the installation at which it will be installed.

Note:

The legal regulations mentioned correspond to the current state of legislation. Each user should ensure, if necessary in consultation with the competent authority, that this AMS meets the legal requirements for the intended use. Furthermore, it cannot be ruled out that legal regulations governing the use of a measuring device for emission monitoring may change during the life-time of the certificate.

The measuring range 0 to 30 mg/m³ corresponded to approx. 0 to 7.5 mg/m³ dust in the field test.

Software version: v1.43**Restrictions:**

1. The measuring device can only be used at plants with constant exhaust gas velocity.
2. The measuring device must not be operated behind electrostatic precipitators.
3. The measuring device may only be used in exhaust gases that are not saturated with water vapor.

Notes:

1. The maintenance interval is four weeks.
2. The dust concentration is measured in the moist exhaust gas under operating conditions.

Certified product

This certificate applies to automated measurement systems conforming to the following description:

This certification applies to automated measurement systems conforming to the following description:

The PFM 20 F is a dust sensor suitable for measuring particle emissions downstream of filter dust collectors. The dust monitor monitors the level of particulate emissions and allows remote monitoring of the condition of filter dust collectors.

Measurement with the PFM 20 F is carried out using the triboelectric measuring principle. The test gas in the waste gas flow is detected with the aid of the probe rod. Due to the dust particles flowing around and bouncing off, a charge exchange takes place between them and the probe rod. The derived current results in a signal that is dependent on the mechanical and electrical properties of the dust. The signal of the measuring system is also dependent on the exhaust gas velocity of the medium to be monitored. The dust-proportional signal, which is generated by the electronics integrated in the unit, is the measurement of the dust content.

The PFM 20 F filter monitor consists of an in-situ probe with probe head and probe rod. The probe rod has a high-temperature coating for insulation. It is surrounded by a sleeve and an insulating body and is thus electrically isolated from the housing. The signal module with the evaluation electronics is located in the probe head.

The PFM 20 F measuring system tested here consists of:

- The PFM 20 F measuring system with the current software and
- A cable connecting the probe with the electronics.

The PFM20_HID software is required to operate the PFM 20 measuring system with a PC.

A standard notebook PC is required to parameterise the measuring system and to display the measured results of the AMS. The data is transferred via a specific USB cable.

The measuring probe is mounted on the flue to be measured using a flange with a Tri-Clamp quick-release fastener.

General notes

This certificate is based upon the equipment tested. The manufacturer is responsible for ensuring that on-going production complies with the requirements of the EN 15267. The manufacturer is required to maintain an approved quality management system controlling the manufacture of the certified product. Both the product and the quality management systems shall be subject to regular surveillance.

If a product of the current production does not conform to the certified product, TÜV Rheinland Energy GmbH must be notified at the address given on page 1.
